Warm Blankets is always growing through outreach and networking. Donations of fabrics and fleece continue to arrive at the workshop. Grants and fundraising provide funds to purchase the excellent polar fleece used on the backing of our blankets. This is purchased in bulk from Dean Textiles in Melbourne. There is a wide selection of colours allowing us to produce blankets for all needs from children, women in refuges, men in rehabilitation and people who are homeless.

I would like to express my thanks to all the volunteers who have stepped up to take on some of my 'Workshop Manager' roles. I will be stepping back from 24/7 at the workshop in 2026 and have already put this into effect with positive success. What will I do with all my spare time? I will still oversee the workshop and liaise with the sub-managers.

A random idea by two people five years ago, Warm Blankets For Everyone has grown into a positive charity successfully supporting those in need. I love the work of Warm Blankets and the numerous people I have met over the past five years. I never cease to be amazed at the wonderful collection of worthwhile talents. So many friendships have and continue to be formed. This is particularly important to all as we navigate our busy lives of family, friends, health and aging.

DISTRIBUTIONS (Di Ebert)

Well, it's been another very big year for the Distribution Team!

Since 1 February this year we have supplied **3,092 blankets**.

The number is made up of 2,432 fleece backed blankets, 582 crochet / knitted blankets and 81 woollen blankets. I want to make a big call out and thank you to our dear friends at Quirky Quilters who continue to support us. They have given us 226 quilts and 30 crochet rugs this year. Their ongoing support is very much appreciated.

In addition to the blankets we have provided 512 Beanies, 133 Gloves & 336 Scarfs. We were also able to deliver 50 Care Packs donated by the Lake Macquarie are Woollies stores.

Teams have "pinned" some 2,179 blankets in workshop sessions this year using 101 rolls of fleece. That is over 2 kilometres of fleece. AMAZING! This is a magnificent effort for all those involved. Well done teams!!




